The Report of Survey serves an important function in providing the background to the issues which the plan must address and the information it contains help form the basis upon which policies have been prepared. The information it contains is extensive and is set down in a format which corresponds to the chapter titles followed in the Written Statement and does not mix survey material with policy. Where new information requires reference it is not the intention to replace the report in its entirety but rather new information which helps to clarify, inform and update the plan and its policies will be brought forward through an Addendum. Most of Section 2 is merely the informed guesses (forecasts) of how employment, households and population are expected to develop 1998-2016.

Surely the correct order is for the survey report to examine the situation and identify issues leading to the preparation of strategies in the plan, and not the other way round.			
174.1 - - Banchory Academy School Board, Banchory Academy School Board	The ROS states that "Until recently, development in the town was severely constrained by a lack of waste water treatment capacity and school facilities" (page 44) The objectors cannot comment on any former constraint regarding the waste treatment capacity but existing school facilities continue to be overcrowded, and they regard the ROS to be inaccurate in this regard.
